**Help wanted!** Jody Hoffmann has been our Coffee Hour coordinator for many years, and has decided to “retire” from the coordinator position. Many thanks to Jody for her work. We usually have a Coffee Hour September through May following the worship service.

The responsibilities of the lead person are as follows:
