

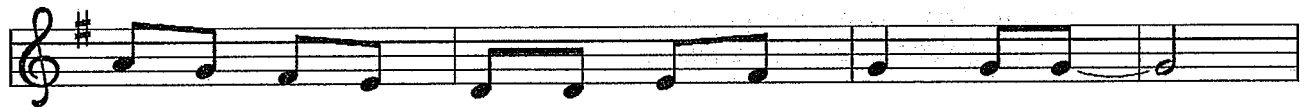

Help wanted! Jody Hoffmann has been our Coffee Hour coordinator for many years, and has decided to "retire" from the coordinator position. Many thanks to Jody for her work. We usually have a Coffee Hour September through May following the worship service.

The responsibilities of the lead person are as follows:

Get volunteers to provide treats, make coffee, and clean up afterwards and if a Sunday is open on the sign-up sheet, then the coordinator provides coffee hour.

Advise volunteers how to make coffee—usually 25 to 30 cups unless a meeting is going on during coffee hour, then more like 40 cups. There are instructions for coffee making on the bulletin board in the kitchen.

Make sure there is juice in the frig for all groups—this is in addition to the lemonade which is generally used for funerals. Generally, 2 packs twice a year were purchased, sometimes others put juice in the refrigerator to be used.
