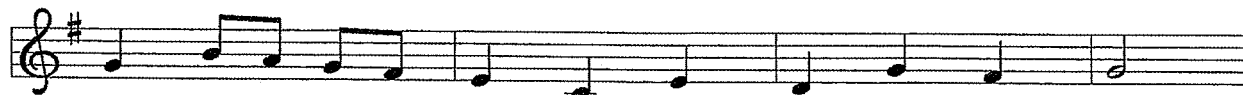

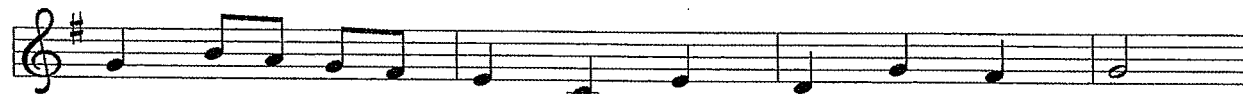

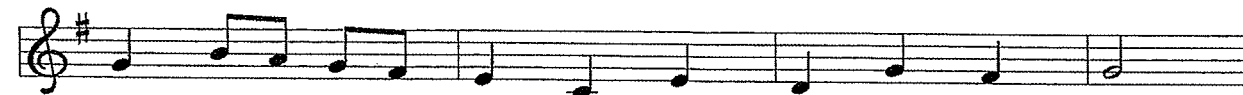

<sup>14</sup> King Herod heard of the disciples preaching, for Jesus' name had become known. Some were saying, “John the baptizer has been raised from the dead; and for this reason these powers are at work in him.” <sup>15</sup> But others said, “It is Elijah.” And others said, “It is a prophet, like one of the prophets of old.” <sup>16</sup> But when Herod heard of it, he said, “John, whom I beheaded, has been raised.”

Please consider donating blood at Trinity's blood drive on **Saturday, July 17 from 8:30am-12:30pm**. Versiti Blood Center of Wisconsin recently issued an emergency appeal for blood donations as communities across the state face a potential crisis with blood supplies dropping to critically low levels. Compared to a typical year, Versiti is down more than 40 percent in donations – or nearly 20,000 units of blood – while the need for blood has increased nearly 10 percent over historical averages. All blood types are needed, with type O-negative and O-positive blood most in demand.

By donating just one pint of blood, you have the potential to save up to three lives.
