Others were tortured, refusing to accept release, in order to obtain a better resurrection. ³⁶ Others suffered mocking and flogging and even chains and imprisonment. ³⁷ They were stoned to death; they were sawn in two; they were killed by the sword; they went about in skins of sheep and goats, destitute, persecuted, tormented— ³⁸ of whom the world was not worthy. They wandered in deserts and mountains and in caves and holes in the ground.

³⁹ Yet all these, though they were commended for their faith, did not receive what was promised, ⁴⁰ since God had provided something better so that they would not, apart from us, be made perfect.

12 Therefore, since we are surrounded by so great a cloud of witnesses, let us also lay aside every weight and the sin that clings so closely, and let us run with perseverance the race that is set before us, ² looking to Jesus, the pioneer and perfecter of faith, who for the sake of the joy that was set before him endured the cross, disregarding its shame, and has taken his seat at the right hand of the throne of God.

Help wanted! Jody Hoffmann has been our Coffee Hour coordinator for many years, and has decided to “retire” from the coordinator position. Many thanks to Jody for her work. We usually have a Coffee Hour September through May following the worship service.

The responsibilities of the lead person are as follows:

Get volunteers to provide treats, make coffee, and clean up afterwards and if a Sunday is open on the sign-up sheet, then the coordinator provides coffee hour.

Advise volunteers how to make coffee—usually 25 to 30 cups unless a meeting is going on during coffee hour, then more like 40 cups. There are instructions for coffee making on the bulletin board in the kitchen.

Make sure there is juice in the frig for all groups—this is in addition to the lemonade which is generally used for funerals. Generally, 2 packs twice a year were purchased, sometimes others put juice in the refrigerator to be used.
