



First Reading Numbers 11:4-6, 10-16, 24-29

⁴The rabble among them had a strong craving; and the Israelites also wept again, and said, "If only we had meat to eat!" ⁵We remember the fish we used to eat in Egypt for nothing, the cucumbers, the melons, the leeks, the onions, and the garlic; ⁶but now our strength is dried up, and there is nothing at all but this manna to look at."

¹⁰Moses heard the people weeping throughout their families, all at the entrances of their tents. Then the LORD became very angry, and Moses was displeased. ¹¹So Moses said to the LORD, "Why have you treated your servant so badly? Why have I not found favor in your sight, that you lay the burden of all this people on me? ¹²Did I conceive all this people? Did I give birth to them, that you should say to me, 'Carry them in your bosom, as a nurse carries a sucking child, to the land that you promised on oath to their ancestors'? ¹³Where am I to get meat to give to all this people? For they come weeping to me and say, 'Give us meat to eat!' ¹⁴I am not able to carry all this people alone, for they are too heavy for me. ¹⁵If this is the way you are going to treat me, put me to death at once—if I have found favor in your sight—and do not let me see my misery."

¹⁶So the Lord said to Moses, "Gather for me seventy of the elders of Israel, whom you know to be the elders of the people and officers over them; bring them to the tent of meeting, and have them take their place with you."

²⁴So Moses went out and told the people the words of the LORD; and he gathered seventy elders of the people, and placed them all around the tent. ²⁵Then the LORD came down in the cloud and spoke to him, and took some of the spirit that was on him and put it on the seventy elders; and when the spirit rested upon them, they prophesied. But they did not do so again.

The Pack Is Back!

Help provide food and hope! At the **Food Pack for Hunger Relief, held at Trinity on Saturday, Oct. 2**, work together to pack fortified meals to be sent to hungry people in countries such as Haiti and El Salvador. Our goal is to fill three 90-minute shifts:

9-10:30am • 10:30am-noon • noon-1:30pm

There are four tables per shift, with eight people at each table working in assembly-line fashion to pack fortified meals. Sit-down jobs are available for those who don't wish to stand the whole time.

Along with packers, we also need monetary donations to make this happen -- we hope to pack 96 boxes, and Trinity pays \$43.20 per box for the cost of food and shipping. There's no fee to participate, but we'll gladly welcome donations of any amount, whether or not you help pack. You can donate when you come to pack, or you can give through the church office or the offering plate (if donating by check, please make your check out to "Trinity Lutheran Church" with "Food Pack" on the memo section of the check). Thank you so much for any contribution you can make!

This event is open to all – from grade-schoolers on up – and your help is needed! At this point, wearing masks is strongly recommended, as the event is indoors and we work fairly closely together. **Advance sign-up is required to reserve your spot, so we can reach you with any updates if needed.** To sign up, please contact Linda in the church office at 262-377-0610 or office@trinitycedarburg.org. Welcome! We're so glad you're here! Here's some information we thought might be helpful.

We love it when children come to worship! We have a nursery downstairs, if needed, and activity bags for younger children are available in the back of church for use during the service.

Restrooms and a drinking fountain are downstairs off the dining room. A handicapped-accessible restroom is located in the Parish Hall -- use the pulpit-side door in the front of the sanctuary.

Holy Communion is celebrated at every worship service. We believe that all of God's children are welcome to the Lord's Table. We practice "open communion," which means if you commune in your home church, you are welcome to commune here as well. Children who do not commune are welcome to come forward for a blessing.
