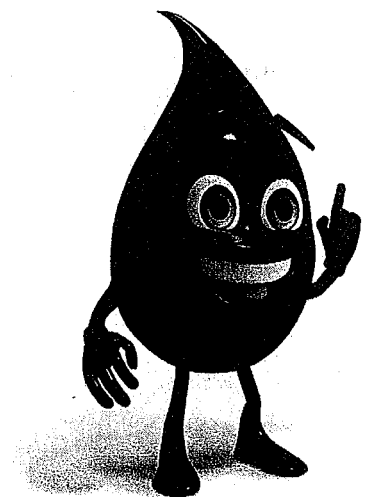
Website Team Needed
